

IBM JUNIOR YEAR CLINIC FINAL EVALUATION

APRIL 2017

During the spring semester of the 2016-2017 school year, students in the IBM program participated in their junior year clinic experiences. An online application system (i.e., *Qualtrics*) was used to facilitate the administration of the midterm evaluation to provide feedback to supervisors, advisors, and students. Results were aggregated across 120 individuals. Results are intended to serve as a final summative evaluation for juniors in their second clinic placement

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✓ Elementary Education was the most popular certification area with 37/120 or 31% of students within targeting this area.
- ✓ Students were evenly distributed across grades.

Performance Areas

- ✓ On average students received the highest scores in the *Demonstrates Responsibility and Professionalism* domain where the average score (on a scale from 1-3) was a 2.8 and 81.67% of students were rated as "Exceeding Expectations".
- ✓ On average students scored lowest in the Attends clinic placement/ school-related events as scheduled domain where the average score (on a scale from 1-3) was a 2.52 and 55.00% of students were rated as "Exceeding Expectations".
- ✓ On average students also scored lower in the *Exhibits a growing awareness of students' needs* & *instructional strategies* domain where the average score (on a scale from 1-3) was a 2.54 and 54.17% of students were rated as "Exceeding Expectations".
- ✓ The average of a student's summed scores was a 14 which fell just below the target of 15 (indicating that students "Exceed Expectations" in all domains).
- ✓ Scores suggest that, within all performance areas, the majority of students are "Exceeding Expectations".
