

INTEGRATED BACHELORS/MASTERS (IB/M) JUNIOR CLINIC EVALUATION FROM THE FALL OF 2013

DECEMBER 2013

Students in their junior year of the IB/M program participate in a school-based clinic experience. The junior clinic student evaluation form is completed using an online application system (i.e., *Checkbox*). The purpose of this report is to summarize the results of these evaluations for the Fall semester of 2013. A brief narrative, tables/graphs with quantitative information, and verbatim qualitative responses are provided. All names have been omitted from the provided feedback in order to maintain anonymity.

A total of 127 completed forms were received for juniors in the IB/M program through December 15, 2013.

- ✓ Many students received the highest possible rating ("4 Exceeds Expectations") in these areas:
 - Demonstrates Responsibility and Professionalism (69.60%)
 - Transitioning from Student to Professional (62.10%)
 - Exhibits a Growing Awareness of Students' Needs and Instructional Strategies (41.46%)
 - Utilizes Observation and Reflection Activities (55.20%)
 - Attends Clinic Placement/School-Related Events as Scheduled (53.23%)
- ✓ Close to 100% of the clinic students met or exceeded expectations in every area assessed.
- ✓ In provided qualitative feedback, the majority of clinic supervisors stated that they were impressed by their student's professional and personable demeanor.
- ✓ When asked to provide an area for potential improvement, supervisors consistently suggested that students take a more active role in the classroom.

Results are further disaggregated across the 7 fields of interest within the Appendices A-G (Elementary, English/Language Arts, History/Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, and Special Education).
